- Promoting fiscal, monetary and trade and investment policies that aim at achieving inclusive, sustainable and resilient economic growth.
- Reducing inequalities, formalizing the informal economy, addressing insecure forms of work and promoting and enabling environment.
- Advancing research and improving data on the potential of Sustainable Development Goals.
- Promoting international cooperation and solidarity mechanisms to work towards COVID 19 vaccine equity.
